ASSELIN, Jean-François

Roncey 20.IV.1771 – Moscow 1808

Pastel portraitist from a family of artists from Coutances; he and his father François-Jacques were pupils of Robert Bichue (1705–1789). It is said that he worked in the royal porcelain factory in Paris (Sèvres?) around 1790. He emigrated during the Revolution and lived in Dresden until 1801, where he copied pastels by Mengs (his *Amor*, in black chalk, was described as “voll Kraft und Leben”) and exhibited two of his own pastels which demonstrated “Weichheit und gefällige Behandlung”. He returned to France in 1801 before settling definitively in St Petersburg, where according to older sources he married a Russian princess shortly before his death in St Petersburg in 1803. The family archives however suggest that he married a French woman, Julie, and died in Moscow in 1808.
