ABERLI, Johann Ludwig

Winterthur 1723 – Bern 1786

Landscape artist who worked in oil and watercolour and made engravings. He moved to Bern in 1741 and was taught by Johann Grimm (*q.v.*), taking over his drawing school on his death. Around the middle of the century he made portraits, some of which were in pastel. A 1751 oil portrait of Aberli (Winterthur, Kunstmuseum) by Handmann (*q.v.*) presages their joint trips around the Bernese Oberland in 1759. Later that year he made a nine-month trip to Paris; after his return he devoted himself to landscape painting. Six landscape drawings were exhibited by “Signior Aberli, Rome”, at the Society of Artists in London in 1790; they may have been his. He is particularly known for his hand coloured etchings in a technique known as the Aberli manner.
