ANNA van Oranje-Nassau, née von Hannover

London 1709 – The Hague 1759

George II's daughter Anne, Princess Royal, married Willem IV in 1734. Like her sisters Caroline and Mary, she was an amateur artist, known for a few copies of portraits and still lifes in pastel, but, according to Walpole, none of them well. Walpole also tells us that Anna drew a portrait of Herman van der Mijn at the instigation of her brother who was impressed by the excellence of van der Mijn's portrait of her husband. Van der Mijn moved to The Netherlands with her, and it may be assumed that he guided her drawing. (Several of his own children worked in pastel.) Anna commissioned portraits by Liotard (*q.v.*) of her advisers Willem Bentinck and Ludwig Ernst von Braunschweig in 1755.
