ARLAUD, Marc-Louis

Orbe 1772 – Lausanne 1.V.1845 When very young, Marc-Louis Arlaud was sent to Yverdon where he earned a living making pastel or crayon portraits. His savings enabled him to study in Geneva in the studios of his cousins Jérémie and Louis-Ami Arlaud (q.v.). Later he travelled to Paris to work with the miniaturist Antoine-Louis Romanet. From 1796 he was listed as a pupil of David. He was also befriended by Mme Condorcet (q.v.). He was exiled by Napoleon. In 1822 he became director of the École de dessin at Lausanne, and in 1841 he founded the musée Arlaud. The basis of attribution of a retrospective coloured chalk drawing is unclear; perhaps there is a confusion with Jacques-Antoine Arlaud (q.v.).
