AUGUSTIN, Jean-Baptiste- Jacques

Saint-Dié 1759 – Paris 1832

Important miniaturist who also worked in other media. His early training is obscure, there being little evidence to support Williamson's claim that he was a pupil of Jean Girardet and Jean-Baptiste-Charles Claudot in Nancy. In any case he travelled to Paris in 1781, and joined the workshop of Gaetan Philpon. Often in a landscape setting, his portraits of the 1790s develop the style of Hall. A group of several dozen drawings (in Lille, the Louvre and elsewhere) in black and white chalk on beige paper, erroneously described as in pastel in some sources, have been incorrectly attributed to Augustin. No signed pastel in the conventional sense is known, although his brother, known as Dubourg (*q.v.*), made several in the early stages of his career. Pappé 2015 has plausibly suggested however that the Versailles pastel of the prince de Condé may be one of the ten versions (8 in oil, 2 in miniature) which Augustin recorded in 1784/85; it was in his estate collection. If the pastel seems less accomplished than most of Augustin's œuvre, that may be because it is an early exercise in a medium Augustin did not pursue.
