BACON, John, Jr

London bpt 7.IV.1777 – Bath 14.VII.1859

The son of the sculptor John Bacon RA (John Russell's friend), John Jr was also a sculptor as well as a miniaturist and draughtsman. He appears to have used pastel from time to time, well into the nineteenth century and so not catalogued here. However in his will the sculptor mentions "the bad but tolerably like portrait of that good man Uncle Raybould in Crayons painted by myself when a young lad."
