BAYARD, Mlle

fl. Nancy 1769–72

Unrecorded, presumably amateur artist. She may have been related to the Charles Bayard who headed the faïence factory at Lunéville and later that of Bellevue. A Mlle Bayard, l'aînée is recorded as performing a "concerto" (apparently a sonata) for two keyboards with the composer Jean-Baptiste Klimrath before Mesdames de France in Lunéville in 1761 (Fillion de Charigneu, *Journal...*, Nancy, 1761, p. 65). An anonymous pastel of the step-mother of the two sons of a conseiller-auditeur à la cour des comptes de Lorraine may have been done at much the same time, but the technique is not sufficiently close to be attributed to the same artist (*v. Éc. fr.*).
