BERNINI, Rosalba Adelaide Clorinda, Sig.ra Corci

Parma 1762 – Milan 1829

Daughter of Clemente Bernini, from Rome; she worked in Parma, specialising in botanical watercolours, adding two new volumes to her father's work *Orientalia dell'Europa meridionale*, now in the Biblioteca Palatina in Parma. She was made an honorary member of the Accademia Clementina, where she was described as a "miniatrice romana". On her marriage in 1781 she moved to Milan where she was still active in 1812. Her early pastels are said to show the influence of Zoffany who worked in Parma at the same time.
