COLSON, Jean-François Gilles, dit

Dijon 1733 – Paris 1803

Son of Jean-Baptiste (*q.v.*); initially a pupil of Frère Imbert at Dijon, then of Nonnotte in Lyon, he became peintre, architecte et sculpteur to the duc de Bouillon, under whose patronage he remained up to the Revolution. He was unmarried; his brother, the actor Jean-Claude Gilles Colson de Bellecourt (1725–1778), was a former pupil of Carle Van Loo who abandoned painting for the stage. A member of the Académie de Saint-Luc, Colson exhibited also at the open salons of 1793, 1795 and 1799. He was listed in the *Almanach des peintres* of 1776 as a portraitist, rue du Petit Bourbon, près Saint-Sulpice. His portraits offered excellent likenesses, with simple but satisfying poses and good perspective.

His obituarist, Nicolas Ponce (*Athénée des arts*, 9 vendémiaire, an XII), wrote “Il peignait aussi le pastel avec une grande facilité. La Tour, dont la réputation est si connue, l’avait sollicité, mais sans succès, de se livrer à ce genre exclusivement. En général, ses portraits étaient de la plus exacte ressemblance. Ses choix d’attitudes, quoique simples, étaient heureux; sa parfaite connaissance de la perspective lui faisait tirer un parti avantageux d’un espace borné. Ses talens lui auraient ouvert, sans doutes, les portes de l’Académie, si la franchise avec laquelle il s’exprimait quelquefois sur les productions des membres de ce corps respectable ne lui eût fait craindre de s’y présenter.”

However none of his pastels has survived. Saunier lists the portrait of his father in Dijon as the sole example, but this is an oil painting (unless there is another version). The copy after Colson’s famous painting *Le Repos* is not sufficiently distinctive to be attributed. The remaining record is an attribution on an unexplained basis.
