DODD, Daniel Potter

London p.1753–1790

The son of Daniel Dodd (*q.v.*) and his wife, née Rebecca Potter. He exhibited one crayon as well as sketches, miniatures, oils and landscapes at the Free Society between 1768 and 1778, as Master Dodd, then D. P. Dodd, 3 Old Bailey, and Mr Dodd, Jr. His picture of the death of Captain Cook, 1784 (“Drawn by D. P. Dodd and others who were on the spot”), is of some interest. Daniel Potter Dodd was buried at St Martin-in-the-Fields, 20.VI.1790.
