DUBOIS, Frédéric

fl. Paris 1795–1820

The miniaturist Frédéric Dubois exhibited at Salons from 1795 to 1804 from addresses in Paris (rue Neuve-des-Petits-Champs, 1795; 414 rue Neuve-Saint-Marc, 1796; 549 rue de Gramont, 1798–99; 27 place des Victoires, 1801), including one drawing “aux crayons de couleur”. He worked in Russia from 1804 to 1818, where he was a member of the Academy of St Petersburg, and travelled then to London, exhibiting at the Royal Academy in 1818 and 1819. Although some drawings are known, the pastel from the 1780 Salon de la Correspondance cited as his in several sources seems more likely to be by the pastellist Nicolas-Anne (*q.v.*).
