DUCREUX, Antoinette-Clémence, Mme Maignen

Paris 13.VI.1776 – Vendôme 11.IV.1843

The fifth child of the pastellist Joseph Ducreux (*q.v.*), is said to have painted miniatures and pastels in her father's studio. In 1801 she married her cousin César Maignen de Sainte-Marie, and a number of Ducreux's works descended to her granddaughter Gabrielle Gendron. Although only 11 years old in 1787 when the fairly naïve portrait of a man was done, she seems more likely to be responsible than any of her siblings. The achievement is less than one would expect from the 26-year-old Rose-Adélaïde. Emmanuel (1765–c.1812) was initially trained as an artist, but abandoned his studies to turn to music, becoming a bassoonist at the Théâtre-Français in 1789. Adrien-Charles died in 1776, aged 10. Alexandre-Jules (1772–1799), a draughtsman and soldier, was an élève in the école de l'Académie royale aged 14, and could be responsible for the pastel. Auguste-Joseph (1770–1799), may also have been an artist.
