DURANT, Mlle

fl. France 1763–83

Also Durand or Dunant. The author of the pastel of Choiseul noted by Ratouis de Limay may well be the Mlle Durant who exhibited pastel portraits “qui ont le mérite de la ressemblance et du dessin” at the place Dauphine in 1767 according to the *Avant-Coureur*. The date of the earlier of the Compiègne pastels (1763), and the unchanged signature on the later, preclude their being by Mme Gros (*q.v.*). The pastellist cannot be identified with Flavie Durand, daughter of the history painter Jean-Baptiste (or Giambattista) Durand, and wife of Felippo Giannetti, since the latter died in 1701. Stylistically these pastels could be by the Durand working in Nancy in 1783, although the inscription on the back of the pastel of the wife of a lieutenant criminel at Bar-le-Duc includes nothing to indicate that that artist is female. A religious pastel signed and dated 1766, but in a completely different style than any of the surviving portraits, confounds the confusion, particularly as it was acquired in Nancy.

Subject matter, location and dating suggest that the artist may have been the daughter of Jacques Durand (1696–1778), a pupil of Nattier and a student in Rome before his return to Nancy where he married in 1729 and made a number of religious paintings. Two sons are recorded, both it seems called Jean-François: the elder (c.1730–p.1785) left a religious painting signed simply Durand, as well as a portrait signed Jean-François Durand; this could alternatively be the work of his brother (1731–1813; on 9.IX.1766 he married Barbe, daughter of Claude-François Nicole, graveur du roi), but, as a copy of a portrait by Bernardino Nocchi, it is difficult to identify a personal style.

The same possibilities arise for the unknown M. Durand or Durant responsible for miniature mythological and genre pastels which of course may not be by the same hand.

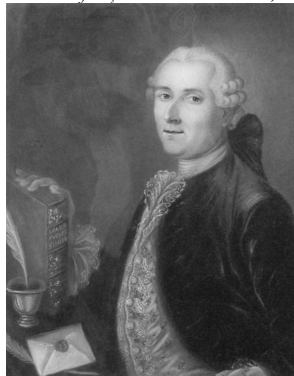
