GALANTINI, Il padre Ippolito

Florence 1627–1706

Capuchin monk and miniaturist (not to be confused with his homonym, Beato Ippolito Galantini, 1565–1615). He is said to have been a pupil of Giovanni Battista Stefaneschi, but was also close to Giovanna Garzoni. In 1665 he was sent as a missionary to Georgia. His travels then took him to Paris where his talents were highly praised. On his return to Tuscany his miniatures and pastels came to the attention of the Granduchessa Vittoria della Rovere and her protégée, Giovanna Fratellini (*q.v.*). A very similar miniature, in tempera on parchment, is still in the Uffizi (inv. 8945).
