HONNETE, Jean-François

Blâmont 1735 – Frankfurt c.1793

Also Honnête; self-taught pastellist and miniaturist. He moved from his native Lorraine to Frankfurt am Main in 1762 where he married and became a citizen. In 1763 he made several trips to Vienna to make portraits of members of the imperial family and other nobles. He also worked in Mainz and Bruxelles (1782). During the Revolution he fled to The Netherlands. Faber, following Hüsgen, credits him with the invention of wax pastel. The only known example is similar to the work of a fellow Lorrain, Huin (q.v.).
