**KHEVENHÜLLER-Metsch,

Vienna 4.I.1741–27.XI.1805

“La comtesse de Kevennuller, première Dame de Cour de l’Archiduchesse Infant” [Joseph II.’s first wife Isabella de Bourbon-Parme, who died in 1763, an amateur pastellist], paid 264 florins for 6 months of lessons with Pierre-Joseph Lion (*q.v.*) during his stay in Vienna 1760–68. She was Grande-Maitresse et Dame de la clef d’or to the Impératrice Joséphe [Joseph II.’s second wife, Maria Josepha von Bayern] at her funeral in Vienna, 30.V.1767. She was also a Sternkreuz-Ordensdame. A second payment, of 160 florins, is recorded against the untraced name of “comtesse de Kevennuller Steinbach.” The comtesse was the daughter of Johann Joseph Reichsfürst von Khevenhüller-Metsch, and in 1769 she became the second wife of Leopold Willhelm Graf von Kolowrat-Krakowski (1727–1809).
