LE BOUTEUX, Pierre-Michel

Paris 17.XI.1685 – Lille 9.V.1750

Pupil at the Académie royale from 1713; *agréé* 1722; *reçu* 1728. Based for most of his career in Lille, he travelled to London 1738–39, where he made oil portraits of a musician and a fencing master. Several known canvases at Versailles are of high quality, but no pastel has survived. He was a member of the family of gardeners of which five generations worked at Versailles, his father being Jean-Michel Le Bouteux (1648–1694), dessinateur ordinaire des jardins du roi; his brother was a cartographer, Jean-Baptiste-Michel Le Bouteux (1682–1764), who was active in America and died in Lisbon. He married, in Paris, Saint-Benoît, 30.IV.1715, a Marie Mackarty, and again, in Lille, Saint-Étienne, 27.X.1727, Livine-Françoise Fournier.
