LE METTAIS, Pierre-Charles

Fécamp 19.VII.1726 - Paris 29.III.1759 Pupil of Boucher (after whose work he made pastel copies); Pierre-Charles(-Joseph) Le Mettais, Lemettay, or Mettay was the son of Pierre Le Mettay, an orfèvre in Paris, and his wife, Marianne Marcotte. He won the prix de Rome in 1748, and worked in Rome from 1749 to 1753, where his religious paintings show the influence of de Troy. He switched to marine painting, travelling to Turin, where a brother Pierre-Joseph was also mentioned (but is now thought to be a confusion). He returned to France and was agréé by the Académie royale in 1757. His names are given as Pierre-Charles at his burial at Saint-Roch, which was attended by Anton de Peters.
