## LEMONNIER, Anicet-Charles-Gabriel

Rouen 6.VI.1743 – Paris 17.VIII.1824

There was nothing to suggest that the history painter and drawings collector worked in pastel before the appearance of four sheets in a collection of grisaille chalk drawings related to illustrations in the *Histoire de la maison de Bourbon* (tom. V, 1788). They were acquired by the Louvre in 2020 from the same source as fourteen others attributed to Fragonard (*q.v.*). The attribution of these four relies on the related engravings bearing his name by Miger, in reverse. There are significant differences both in quality and handling from the sheets attributed to Fragonard, and although the unusual medium is similar, the material itself also seems different.
