LÉPICIÉ, Nicolas-Bernard

Paris 1735–1784

Son of the engraver and historiographe Bernard Lépicié, Nicolas-Bernard was a pupil at the Académie royale from 1751, and was *agrégé* as a history painter in 1764, *reçu* 1769. He made numerous drawings in chalk and trois crayons, some with touches of pastel, two profiles, “très terminées”, some other works listed in his posthumous sale, and the Prat sheet which according to Rosenberg “tient plus du pastel que l'on souhaite encadrer que de l'étude destinée à être remise en carton”. Nevertheless Lépicié is unlikely to be the artist responsible for many of the genre-type pastel portraits that are too weak to be ascribed to Chardin; and “signatures” on older examples should be treated with caution.

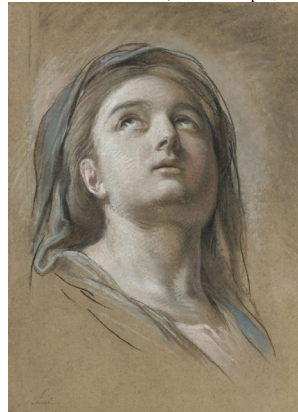
