

LÓPEZ Y PORTAÑA, Vicente

Valencia 1772 – Madrid 1850

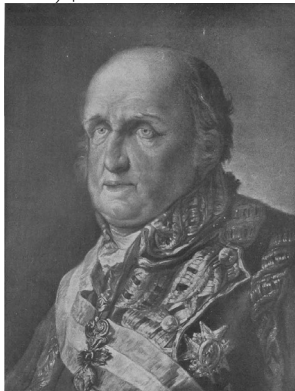
Painter, printmaker and miniaturist. He studied in Madrid before returning to Valencia in 1790 where he became vice-director of the academy. Among his many portraits, a few pastels are known but almost all seem to be from the nineteenth century, after he was appointed painter to Ferdinand VII (1814). A girl with a blue headband shows the clear influence of Bartolozzi in technique and subject matter, and probably also dates from the early nineteenth century.
