PASCH d. y., Lorentz

Stockholm 1733–1805

Also Lorenz, Lorens II Pasch le jeune. After initial training with his father, he went to the Danish academy in 1752 to study under Pilo. In 1757 he travelled to Paris, where Roslin, Boucher, Pierre and Louis-Michel Van Loo became his teachers at the école de l'Académie. He returned to Stockholm in 1766, becoming professor and finally director of the Kungliga Akademi. He worked mainly in oils. Among other members of the family, Ulrika Frederika Pasch (*q.v.*) may have assisted him.



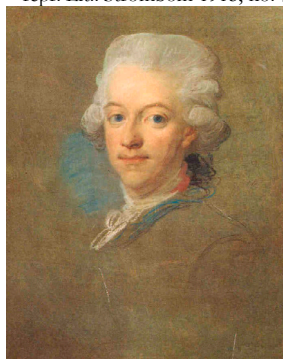
