## **PASETTI, Anna**

*fl.* Venice 1800–6

Deaf and dumb artist who assisted Lodovico Gallina, Jacopo Guarana and Pietro Tantin, copying paintings and engravings. Still alive when Moschini was writing, she was singled out among the numerous Venetian ladies who cultivated the art of Rosalba. The pastels are copies after John Raphael Smith prints.
