## **RASPAL, Antoine**

Arles 1738–1811

The pastel of Barrême exhibited in 1933 could be of a relative of Raspal's protector M. de Barrême de Châteaufort (*q.v.*), whose affair with Raspal's sister led to the artist leaving Arles around 1760; he then studied with Le Barbier in Paris (he was possibly the "Raspald, peintre" awarded second prize at the Académie royale in 1762). He returned to Arles later. Whether the 1933 pastel is to be identified with the anonymous portrait of J.-A. de Barrême auctioned in 2000 is unclear; it seems early to be by Raspal.
