REINWALD, Frau, née Elisabeth Christophine Friederike Schiller

Marbach 1757 – Meiningen 1847

Schiller's sister, in 1786 she married the librarian Wilhelm Friedrich Hermann Reinwald (1737–1815) in Meiningen. One of her subjects, the engraver Ausfeld, was also a pastellist. The surviving example is more of a drawing with coloured chalk than a pastel. In a letter to Frau Schiller, Wilhelm Reinwald, 24.v.1802, describes a visit to the studio of Schröder (*q.v.*); in seeking advice from the famous pastellist, Reinwald suggests that he may also have been an amateur practitioner.
