RENOU, Antoine

Paris 1731–1806

History and religious painter; pupil of Pierre and then Vien, premier peintre du roi Stanislaw 1760–66; author and critic. He was *agréé* 1766, *reçu* 1781 at the Académie royale, of which he became secrétaire-adjoint in 1776 and secrétaire perpétuel in 1790; his duties included the production of the annual Salon livrets. From 1777 he published a series of letters in the *Journal de Paris* under the pseudonyms Marin, Kergolé etc.; these criticised the relationship between artists and dealers. He was also a member of the academies of St Petersburg, Philadelphia, Richmond and Rouen. He married Louise-Antoinette Lucas, an engraver. He was a cousin of Gilles-Pierre Barbier (*q.v.*), and through him was consulted by Sir Joshua Reynolds. A nephew, Simon-Pierre Renou, was a pupil at the Académie de l'architecture in 1790.

He appears in the Toulouse livret as Renaud. These pastels may have been in the Revolutionary confiscations made in 1796. No other pastel is known, but in 1780 he published a booklet on the *Secret pour fixer le pastel*, a description of the Lorient process. Diderot dismissed him as “un mauvais artiste”.

He is unconnected with the old master collector–dealer, abbé Louis-Joseph Reynoard (*v. COLLECTORS*), whose name was variously misspelt in contemporary sources as Renou, Reynoard etc.
