SABLET, Jean-François

Morges 1745 – Nantes 1819
Sablet went to Paris in 1767 to study with Vien; thence to Rome, returning to Paris in 1777. A carnet dated c.1776 which appeared at auction in Nantes (Talma, 29.I.2015) contains a worklist from 1776 which suggests that he was back in France by then. Among the works listed in oil and miniature were the pastels itemised below; what appear to be prices range from 2 to 5 livres, and seem similar for works in each medium. Only the much later pastel, from 1812 (after his move to Nantes in 1805), has survived. He was an accomplished portraitist and worked with Mme Vigée Le Brun. His brother Jacques (1749–1803) followed a similar career.
