Portraitist in various media; of English origin, he studied in Dublin, and exhibited portraits and still lifes in crayons and oils from South Great George's Street in 1777 and from 13 Great Ship Street in 1780. He was also an engraver; his print after Robert Hunter's portrait of the future 1st Marquess of Buckingham (c.1783) was copied in pastel by P. Adams (*q.v.*). His son, also William (c.1782–1839), was an Irish landscape painter.
