SAINT-AUBIN, Augustin de

Paris 3.I.1736–9.XI.1807

Brother of Gabriel; adjoint à professeur at the Académie de Saint-Luc, agréé 1771 as engraver at the Académie royale; graveur de la Bibliothèque du roi, rue des Prouvaires; listed in the *Almanach des peintres* for 1776 as “Rue Saint-Jean-de-Beauvais; fait des élèves”. The *Almanach* for the following year helpfully distinguishes the four brothers, Charles, Gabriel, Augustin and Louis. Augustin was known mainly for his engravings (many after Cochin) and portrait drawings, some of which are heightened with tiny touches of pastel. One reportedly signed pastel is reattributed to Pougin de Saint-Aubin (*q.v.*), with whose work other confusions may arise.
