The only reference is in the will of the sitter, where Sir William Wilson bequeathed to his cousin Joseph Wilson some pictures, including "my own and my wive's pictures, the last two done by Scott." While no other portrait is known, if (as the 1934 article suggests) the pastel of Sir William dates from the early 1660s, it must have predated that of his wife, whom he married after 1681.
