SHAFTESBURY, Countess of, née Lady Susannah Noel

Rutland 1710 – Petersham 1758

Also Susan. Daughter of the 3rd Earl of Gainsborough, she married Anthony Ashley-Cooper, 4th Earl of Shaftesbury (son of the philosopher) in 1724, at the age of 14 (the marriage took place with his mother's consent but not that of his guardian, giving rise to a legal case). They lived at Wimborne St Giles in Dorset. He was a close friend of Handel. An amateur artist, she was a friend of Mrs Pendarves (later Mrs Delany, *q.v.*). Henry Fielding described her as "the well-shap'd Fair". Two watercolour landscapes by the Countess were also at the family home in 1963.
