TROTTER, Thomas

Ceres, Fife 5.V.1756 – London brd 19.II.1803 A pupil of William Blake, he engraved portraits after Sir Joshua Reynolds as well as pastels by Lawrence and Russell. He was the son of the Rev. Dr John Trotter (1728–1808), pastor of the Scots Church in Swallow Street (and subject of a portrait by Russell, J.64.283), London, by his first wife, Elizabeth Oswald (1733–1772), and cousin of the Scottish cabinet maker William Trotter (1772–1833). On 25.IX.1783, at St Andrew's, Holborn, he married Mary Maria King (1759–1831).
