Volterra 1611 – Florence 1690

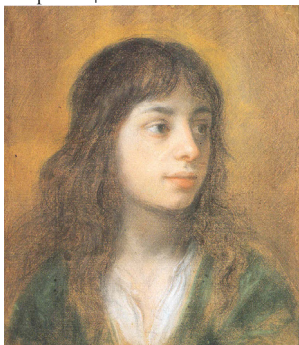
Painter of history, religious and mythological subjects in oil and fresco. He was also a prolific draughtsman in chalk. His use of fresco on tile, in imitation of Giovanni di San Giovanni according to his early biographer Baldinucci, produced works which are reminiscent of pastel in format, texture and luminosity. Gaburri says that many of his pictures, in oil or in pastel, are to be found in noble and other Florentine collections; in all his works there was something “degno di eterna fama e di plauso immortale”.

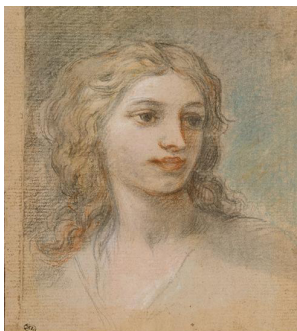
