VAILLANT, Bernard

Lille 1632 – Leiden 1698

Half-brother and pupil of Wallerant Vaillant (*q.v.*), whom he accompanied to Frankfurt in 1658 for the coronation of Kaiser Leopold I. He followed Wallerant to Paris but seems to have returned to Amsterdam by the beginning of 1664 (according to records from the Walloon Church). He married in 1670; after the death of his father in 1675 he moved to Rotterdam. In 1678 he executed an important series of some 20 portraits of the delegates to the Nijmegen peace conference at the end of the Dutch wars. He died during a visit to Leiden.

Bernard seems to have used pastel more systematically than his brother, pushing the art so far that his works are often confused with those of Nanteuil. He abandoned the stiff and severe style of Wallerant, and extended his palette to include pinks, ochres and browns.

Considerable confusion between the brothers' work persists. For example, the Moseley Old Hall portrait of Leopold I. has traditionally been given to Wallerant, but was reattributed on the basis of Bernard's attendance at the Nijmegen conference where it was done. A series of sheets of unknown men at Göttingen attributed to Wallerant included a version of the Leopold portrait, and are reattributed on that basis. The young boy shown wearing the Toison d'or is likely to be the future Kaiser Joseph I.




