⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒ Henry Ashton Case (1851–1935) of Beckford Hall, captain, 12<sup>th</sup> Lancers ∞ 1° 1878 Mary Louisa Southey (–1888); 2° 1891 Alice Southey

⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒ Marguerite “Daisy” Magdalen Ashton Case (–1943) ∞ 1909 Sir Everard Radcliffe, 5<sup>th</sup> Bt (1884–) heir to Sir Joseph Radcliffe of Rudding Park

⇒⇒⇒ John Ashton Case (1779–1836sp)

⇒⇒ Jonathan Case, coal merchant

⇒ Sarah Clayton (1712–1779sa), partner in Clayton, Case & Co., coal merchants, bankrupt 1778 {*Cotes*; *Thornhill*; *Wright of Derby*}
