⇒⇒ Thomas Frederick (1707–1740sp), MP for Shoreham-by-Sea  
⇒⇒ Sir John Frederick, 4<sup>th</sup> Bt (1708–1783), inheriting baronetcy from his cousin by special remainder, MP ∞ 1741 Susannah Hudson  
⇒⇒⇒ Sir John Frederick, 5<sup>th</sup> Bt (1749–1825), MP {*Russell*} ∞ 1778 Mary Garth (–1794) {*Russell*}, dau. of Richard Garth  
⇒⇒⇒⇒ Sir Richard Frederick, 6<sup>th</sup> Bt (1780–1873sa)  
⇒⇒ Sir Charles Frederick (1709–1785), MP, comptroller of ordnance 1749, KB 1761 ∞ 1746 Lucy Boscawen, dau. of Lord Falmouth  
⇒⇒⇒ Charles Frederick (1748–1791), colonel, of the East India Company ∞ 1773 Martha Rigden (1751–1794) {*Romney*}  
⇒⇒ Mary {*Hoare*} ∞ 1733 Alexander Hume (c.1693–1765spm), MP for Southwark, director of the East India Company 1737–48, acquired estate of Wormley Bury 1739 {*Hoare*} *q.v.*  
⇒⇒ Henrietta ∞ 1746 Luke Spence  
⇒⇒ Hannah ∞ 1746 Sir Abraham Hume, 1<sup>st</sup> Bt (–1772) *q.v.*
