William Henry Nassau de Zuylestein, 1st Earl of Rochford (1645–1709) ∞ Jane Wroth (1659–1703)

⇒ Lady Henrietta de Nassau-Zuylestein ∞ 1715 Frederik Christiaan van Reede, 2nd Earl of Athlone (1668–1719) *q.v.*

⇒ William, 2nd Earl of Rochford (1681–1710sp)

⇒ Frederick, 3rd Earl of Rochford (1682–1738) {*Dandidge*} ∞ Lady Elizabeth “Bessy” Savage (1699–1746) {*D’Agar; Van der Bank*} [∞ 2^o Rev. Carter]

⇒⇒ William Henry Nassau de Zuylesteyn, 4th Earl of Rochford (1717–1781), KG 1778, not installed, British envoy to Turin 1749–53, ambassador to Madrid 1763–66, Paris 1766–68; groom of the stole 1755–60, colonel, Essex Militia 1759 {*Bardwell; Duprà; Falconet; Jervas; Perronneau; Sledge;*

Zimcke; Dutch sch.} ∞ 1742 Lucy Young (1723–1773sp) {*?Bardwell; ?Cosway; ?Perronneau*}

⇒⇒⇒ (∞ Martha Harrison) Maria Nassau (1758–1850)

⇒⇒⇒ (∞ Anne Labbe, Mme Johnson) Frederick Nassau (1771–1845)
