Richard Sykes (–1645), alderman of Leeds

⇒ Henry Sykes (1601–1654), of Hunslet Hall, Leeds ∞ Mary Wood

⇒ William Sykes (Leeds 10.ii.1605–1652), republican ∞ Leeds 1625 Grace Jenkinson

⇒ Richard Sykes of Ledston ∞ Elizabeth Scot, dau. of Thomas Scot (–1660), regicide

⇒ Anna (–1740) ∞ 1685 Ralph Thoresby (1658–1725), antiquary {*Parmentier; Verus*}

⇒ William Sykes of Leeds, 4th son

⇒ William Sykes (1660– Bruges 31.xii.1724), probate 11.ii.1724/25, painter and picture dealer of Lincoln's Inn Fields ∞ Mary N (–p.1724)

⇒ William Sykes (–1728), probate 23.v.1728, painter and picture dealer, of Duke Street, Lincoln's Inn Fields ∞ Elizabeth N (–p.1728)

⇒ Francis Valentine Sykes (?London 1715 – Yarmouth c.1.viii.1771), portrait painter and miniaturist ∞ Theresa Rigmaden or Rigmadden

(1713–Uppingham, 6.IV.1791), dau. of Francis Rigmaden of Twickenham, desc. of Francis Yates, Royal Oak annuitant, not of Pendrell, family

⇒ N (19.xi.1755–mj)

⇒ Francis (c.1740– India c.1764) [?∞ Calcutta 1766 Catherine Ridley / ? London 1774 Elizabeth Monckton]

⇒ Henry [not Frankson] Sykes (The Hague 1743/44 – Saint-Rémy 1813), of The Crescent, New Bridge Street, Twickenham, emigrated to France c.1777, opticien privilégié du roi, filateur à Saint-Rémy-sur-Avre 1792 ∞ London c.1766 Grace Birch (1744–1812), dau. of Francis Birch of Uppingham

⇒ Grace Valentine (1768–1817) {*Russell*} ∞ St Anne's Blackfriars 1788 William Waddington (1751–1818) ... ⇒ William Henry Waddington (1826–1894), premier ministre de France & Waddington family of French parlementaires

⇒ Theresa (1749– sp)

⇒ Luke Sykes (–p.1728), continued father's business

⇒ Ann (–p.1740), founded a convent in Bruges

⇒ James Sykes (–1737), prob 13.iv.1737 of St Giles's, announced himself successor to Wm Sykes' business but announced 8.xi.1728 Daily Jnl that his nephew would succeed ∞ Elizabeth N

⇒ Daniel Sykes (1632–), 5th son, ⇒ Sledmere family

Richard Sykes (1678–1726), son of Daniel Sykes ∞ 1<sup>o</sup> Mary Kirkby, co-heiress to the Sledmere estates, 2<sup>o</sup> Martha Donkin

⇒ Richard Sykes (1706–1761sp), High Sheriff of Yorkshire in 1752 ∞ Jane Hobman

⇒ Sir Mark Sykes, 1<sup>st</sup> Bt (1711–1783), of Sledmere, rector of Roos ∞ Decima Twyford Woodham

⇒ Sir Christopher Sykes, 2<sup>nd</sup> Bt (1749–1801), MP for Beverley 1784–90 {*Romney; English sch.*} ∞ 1770 Elizabeth Egerton (1748–1803) of Tatton {*Romney; Russell; English sch.*} *q.v.*

⇒ Sir Mark Masterman Sykes, 3<sup>rd</sup> Bt (1771–1823sp), collector {*Gardner*} ∞ 1<sup>o</sup> 1795 Henrietta Masterman (–1813sp); 2<sup>o</sup> 1814 Mary Elizabeth Egerton

⇒ Sir Tatton Sykes, 4<sup>th</sup> Bt (1772–1863) {*Gardner*} ∞ 1822 Mary Anne Foulis

⇒ Elizabeth Beatrice (–1883) ∞ 1863 Very Rev. George Herbert, son of 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Powis

⇒ Beatrice Hester Decima (1775–1843) {*Gardner; Vaslet*} ∞ 1795 John Robinson Foulis

⇒ Elizabeth (1777–1853) {*Gardner; Vaslet*} ∞ 1806 Wilbraham Egerton (1781–) of Tatton Park *q.v.*

⇒ Joseph Sykes (1723–1805)
